BIRTH RECORDS

1822. Birth of John Morgan on November 29th at Conwil, Caio, Carmarthenshire. Father John Morgan a Gentleman.

1847. Birth of Annie Helena Browne on April 22nd 1847 in Ballingarry, County Limerick, Ireland. Father John Browne a Government Bank Manager.

1841-1857 Alumni Oxoniensis [1715-1886].

John Morgan, the 3rd son of John of Convil Cayo, Carmarthen gentleman. JESUS COLL matric 28 May 1841 aged 18, scholar 1841-8, BA [1845], MA [1847]. Vicar of Nantyglo [1857]

1861 Wales Census living at the Parsonage Aberystroth.

John Morgan aged 38 years, the Perpetual Curate of the Parish of Nantyglo unmarried living with servant Mary Thomas. Also present a visitor, Thomas Evans, the Rector of Gorsley, Monmouth.

1871 & 1881 Wales Census living at the Vicarage, Holy Trinity Church, Nantyglo.

John Morgan, unmarried, with servant Mary Thomas.

1888 MARRIAGE RECORD

11th October. The marriage of John Morgan, bachelor, and Annie Helena Browne, spinster, at The Holy Trinity Church Nantyglo. Witnesses include Annie's sister, Maria [M C Browne] and John's niece Edith Selina Morgan.

1891 Wales Census living at the Vicarage of Holy Trinity Church, Nantyglo.

THE LATE VICAR OF NANTYGLO. On the morning of Monday last, the Rev. John Morgan, vicar, passed away at the Vicarage in Nantyglo at the age of 72. The reverend gentleman, who had been unwell for some time, was struck by an illness approximately two weeks ago that incapacitated him, and he departed on Monday morning around seven o'clock. He had sent a message to his congregation the day before, which was announced by Rev. S. T. Phillips of St. Mary's, Brynmawr, and clearly indicated that the end was approaching. Born in Cardiganshire, he spent some time at St. David's College, Lampeter. He entered Jesus College, Oxford, where he earned a B.A. (Hon. 4th Class Lit. Hum.) in 1845, and two years later, in 1847, he obtained his M.A. In the same year, he was ordained as a deacon by the Bishop of Oxford and as a priest by the Bishop of St. David's. Subsequently, he served as a curate at Nantyglo under his brother, Rev. D. Morgan, who is now the rector in North Wales, for five years before being appointed vicar in 1857. The deceased was a sibling of the current vicar of Romney and brother-in-law to Dr. C. H. Browne, J.P., of Brynmawr, who provided care during his illness. The funeral occurred yesterday (Thursday), with the interment taking place at Llanelly Churchyard in Breconshire. The cortege departed from Trinity Vicarage at 2:34 and was well attended, with the service led by Rev. Canon Evans of Rhymney.
