Verse

1851 Wales Census living in Maesygartha

James James, aged 37 born Pembrokeshire, miner, Hannah James aged 36, James aged 14, William aged 12, Thomas aged 6 and Ann aged 2.

1861 Wales Census living in Parish of Llanelly

James James, aged 47, Forge Labourer, Thomas aged 16 and Ann aged 13

It is believed that Ann's mother Hannah James died in 1859 and was also buried at St Elli, grave location unknown

1870 Marriage record

Marriage banns dated 11th December, Ann James married James Watkins

1871 Wales Census living in Parish of Llanelly

James Watkins, aged 36, miner, Ann Watkins aged 23, wife, Ann Watkins, aged 12 daughter {from previous marriage}

1881 Wales Census living in Turnpike Road, Llanelly

James James, aged 66, agricultural labourer, Thomas James, aged 36, Ann Watkins, daughter married, domestic servant

1891 Wales Census living in Maesygartha, Main Road, Llanelly

Thomas {Thos} James, aged 44 Retired miner, Ann Watkins, aged 39, sister

1901 Wales census living in Turnpike Road, Llanelly

Thomas James, aged 52, head, Ann Watkins, aged 49, sister, housekeeper

1901 Death Records {Crickhowell Oct Nov Dec Volume 11b Page 79

Ann Watkins died and was buried at St Elli Church on the 19th of October
Probate records state of Ffynony Coed Clydach, widow died on the 7th of October 1901 and left effect to Thomas James, Steelworker. This is believed to be her brother who she lived with over the last few decades.
