To be sold at auction at the Beaufort Arms, Llanelly on Thursday 18th day of May 1854, at Five o'clock in the evening, subject to conditions to be then produced, the undermentioned freehold property.

LOT 1.—The substantial and commodious dwelling house situated at Llanelly, adjoining the Clydach Company's upper tram road and near the Clydach Iron Works, in the occupation of Wm. Morgan, Esq. tenant from year to year. The house contains on the ground floor in front—dining room 16ft. by 16ft., parlour 15ft. by 13ft, and large room 19ft. by 16ft. and adapted (if required) for a handsome drawing room, also on the same floor a large kitchen, closet, and other requisite offices; the first floor—four good bedrooms and large room capable of making two good bedrooms ; and underground a spacious and excellent cellar. There is a large and productive garden in front and around the house. Soft water is brought by pipes into the kitchen, and there is a never failing supply of excellent spring water by pump in the kitchen from a well in the cellar. The house is most pleasantly and beautifully situated for private residence and equally advantageously (should the purchaser so require) for business premises. The large room on the ground floor would, form excellent shop for which it was originally constructed, and would have a warehouse behind and large store room over.

Three cottages and Gardens, adjoining lot 1, but wholly separated therefrom, in the several occupations of Joseph Pendry, **Joseph Mayberry**, and Joseph Mathias as monthly tenants at the several rents amounting to £1 4s. 0d, £9 Bs. 0d., and £4 16s. 0d. per annum.
