South Wales Gazette Friday 19th 1930

A native of Llanelly Mrs. Mary Jane Jones, who passed away at 7 Harcourt Crescent, Warm Turn, on Thursday week, came to Abertillery 30 years ago, and for the past 10 years has been resident in the Warm Turn district. The deceased, who was 67 years of age, was a widow of the late Mr. William Smith Jones, who met his death as a result of an accident sustained at the Vivian Colliery in 1920. The deceased is survived by two sons and a daughter—Mr. Garfield Jones, 8 Harcourt Crescent, Warm Turn, Mr. William Jones and Maud Jones. Funeral took place at Llanelly Church.

Late Mr. W. S. Jones. The death has taken place after a week's illness, caused by an accident at the Vivian Colliery, at his residence, 48. Duke Street, of Mr. W. S. Jones. In loving memory of our dear father, Mr. W. S. Jones of Duke Street, Abertillery, beloved husband of Mrs. M. Jones, who died January 13th. Aged 59 years. He was leaving his place of labour where he earned his daily bread, when he slipped on a haulage rope, ' Causing slight injury to his head. For a few days he went on in his usual manner, 'Till suddenly he was forced to his bed And within ten days from the day he had it, Septic poison set in and our father was dead. South Wales gazette January 16th, 1920

Death Occurred on a Tuesday evening, William Smith Jones married aged 59 resided at 48 Duke Street. Met with an accident on the 03/01/1920 whilst working at Vivian Pit, he fell and cut his head. Death occurred possibly as result of complications.

1921 Wales Census his widow Mary Janes is recorded as living with their two children William Jones aged 21 and Maud Jones aged 19 at 7 Harcourt Crescent. Their other son Garfield Jones was residing at number 8 Harcourt crescent with wife Emily Jane, children Edna and Aldwyn.
